English

The Viewer – Shaun Tan and Gary Crew We will read the adventure themed picture book, The Viewer, and explore it in detail. Our focus will be on the style it is written in, the setting and how the story unravels. We will practise the grammar and writing techniques before planning and writing our own adventure/mystery stories following the format of The Viewer. NON-FICTION FOCUS??In reading we will be looking at The Alchemist's Letter, Beowulf and 3 mark styled questions, analysing them using VIPERS styled questions.

PE

This term we will learn to play tag rugby. We will work on our passing and receiving the ball skills, attacking and defending

Geography

Our focus this term will be on Sustainability and how our actions impact the world around us. We will investigate what 'food miles' and 'carbon footprint' mean and how we can improve what we do to reduce these. In addition, we will develop our understanding of the positive impact that Fair Trade has on the global community.

In French, children will learn six hobbies and engage in conversations with each other to say which hobbies they like and dislike. They will then apply these skills to write simple and complex sentences explaining which hobbies they like and dislike.

Music

In music, children will be exploring how chords can add another layer to music and we will use this knowledge when creating our own compositions.

Maths

In maths we be multiplying and dividing 2-digit numbers. We will also be rounding and solving problems with numbers up to 7-digits. We will be looking at shape and their properties as well as making 3D shapes from 2D nets. Finally, we will be solving problems using equivalence by scaling factors. We will be revising and deepening our knowledge of calculations involving fractions. Additionally, we will explore percentages and BIDMAS.

<u>Art</u>

In this unit, Year 6 pupils will create an artwork using a range of materials such as paint, glue, sand and sawdust.
